NARRATIVE SUMMARY

The 7th Engineer Battalion continued support of the III Marine Amphibious Force within the DaNang area. Platoons from the attached 1st and 3rd Bridge Companies are rendering additional support in the Chu Lei, Hue/Phu Bai, and Dong Ha area.

Company "A", 7th Engineer Battalion continues upgrading of Routes 33, 13C and 30 for class 50 traffic. Work also continued on the Ha Thanh Dam with that project being approximately 65% complete at the end of the reporting period.

Company "B", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 1 for class 50 traffic.

Company "C", 7th Engineer Battalion continues upgrading of Route 5 north for class 50 traffic.

Company "D", 7th Engineer Battalion continued upgrading of Route 5 south for class 50 traffic.

Progress continued on the DaNang Barrier by the 7th Engineer Battalion and supporting units. A total of 14,250 meters of tactical wire has been installed. 31 towers have been constructed and eleven towers installed. Some delay was encountered due to enemy activity there were a total of 84booby traps encountered, 17 mines were detonated resulting in the loss of 4 TD=20's, 1 Einco, and 1 M-54 truck. Casualties sustained were 16 WIA and 5 KIA's for the month.

l July: An Hoa road - hauled and spread 366 cu.yds. of crushed rock from (AT 909485) to (AT 910487). Hauled and spread 441 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 909485) to (AT 910487). Cleared possible ambush sight on Route 5 (AT 906485). Company "D" worked on bunkers and defensive positions within the Company CP. 1st Bridge Company stagged a 5 float reinforced raft to the Song Thu Bon river.

2 July: Hauled and spread 255 cu.yds. of crushed rock and 85 cu.yds. of fill on Route 1 south. Hauled and spread 103 cu.yds. of fill on Route 5, south. An Hoe road - installed 36"X40' culvert at AT 910487. To date there have been thirty-eight WIA's and 3 KIA's on the An Hoe road upgrading project. Sixteen mine have been found and removed and eight have been detonated by vehicles or personnel walking on the road.

3 July: Hauled and spread 220 cu.yds. of fill and 6,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 100 cu.yds. of rock from (AT 910487) to (AT 909490). Assembled 70' of 36" culvert at An Hoa. 1st Bridge Company built 5 float reinforced raft at the Song Thu Bon.

4 July: Hauled and spread 350 cu.yds. of fill and 30 cu.yds. of blast rock on Route 1 north. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 140 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 910487) to (AT 909490). Worked on shelters in Company "D" CP area at An Hoa. 1st Bridge Company will replace M-4 metal pontoons with M4T6 rubber pontoons on the Song Thu Bon ferry.

5 July: No security was provided for the north sweep team on Route 5 to An Hoa. Hauled and spread 250 cu.yds. of fill and 65 cu.yds. of "shot rock" on Route 1 south. An Hoa road - Prepared site for emplacement of 60" culvert (AT 908481). Spread 405 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 910487) to (AT 908492).

6 July: Company "B" reports upgrading of Route 1, section II Dien Ban is 70% complete. An Hoa road - Installed one 40'X60" corrugated culvert at (AT 908481). Hauled and spread 140 cu.yds. of fill at culvert site (AT 908481).

7 July: Company "B" filled in a road crater on Anderson Trail west. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 373 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 908478) to (AT 909483). Hauled and spread 153 cu.yds. of crushed rock from (AT 909489) to (AT 909492).

8 July: Hauled and spread 130 cu.yds. of crushed rock and 6,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. Hauled and spread 8,000 gallons of bunker oil on Route 5. An Hoe road - Hauled and spread 391 cu.yds. of rock from (AT 909492) to (AT 907491). Began work on ferry approaches for installation of 2nd ferry at the Song Thu Bon river.

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9 July: Hauled and spread 150 cu.yds. of crushed rock, 6000 gallons of water and 2,000 gallons of bunker oil on Route 1 south. Hauled and spread 562 cu.yds. from (AT 908492) to (AT 907494). Worked on protective shelters at An Hoa CP. In addition to the 37 WIA's and 3 KIA's taken last month, there has been 14 more WIA's and 1 KIA to date.

10 July: Hauled and spread 160 cu.yds. of crushed rock, 35 cu.yds. of blast rock and 6,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 302 cu.yds. of crushed rock from (AT 909194) to (AT 909501). No security will be provided for An Hoa road sweep from Phu Loc-6 to check point 4 on 11 July 1968. This is due to rotation of personnel at Liberty Bridge. This will not however affect upgrading operations on the southern portion of the road.

13 July: Hauled and spread 155 cu.yds. of crushed rock, 130 cu.yds. of fill, and 6,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. Company "B" reports that the upgrading of Route 1, section II - Dien Ban, is 75% complete. Company "C" personnel have burned off one portion at ASP-1 minefield. They will coordinate with ASP-1 personnel and begin removal of mines 15 Jul 1968. An Hoa road ~ Spread 199 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 909494) to (AT 908496). Opened fill pit at Phu Loc-6.

12 July: Hauled and spread 350 cu.yds. of fill and 1,100 gallons of water on Route 1 south. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 350 cu.yds. of rock from (AT 907494) to (AT 909501). Spread 8,700 gallons of bunker oil from (AT 896968) to (AT 907494).

13 July: Hauled and spread 185 cu.yds. of fill and 75 cu.yds. of blast rock on Route 1 south. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 400 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 904473) to (AT 908479).

14 July: An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 619 cu.yds, of fill from (AT 908479) to (AT 910488). Hauled 392 cu.yds, of fill to south approach of the Song Thu Bon River for ferry.

15 July: Hauled and spread 265 cu.yds. of crushed rock and 7,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. Have found and disarmed 34 mines and removed 6 at the ASP-1 minefield. Hauled and spread 264 cu.yds. of fill at south approach of the Song Thu Bon ferry. As directed by the III MAF Engineers two ferries will be in operation at the Song Thu Bon River by the close of work on 16 July 1968.

16 July: An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 220 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 909491) to (AT 907501) and graded same. 325 cu.yds. of fill hauled and spread at the Song Th Bon ferry approaches. 2nd Ferry (86'8") is now operational at the Song Thu Bon river.

17 July: Hauled and spread 145 cu.yds. of crushed rock, 100 cu.yds. of fill, and 7,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. Company "B" has driven a total of 10 piles at the Ha Thanh Bridge site. 25% of the ASP-1 minefield has been removed. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 504 cu.yds, of fill from Song Thu Bon Ferry to (AT 928527) check point 6.

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18 July: Hauled and spread 350 cu.yds. of fill and 3,000 gallons of water on Route 1. Company "3" found and removed 51 mines at the ASP-1 minefield. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 240 cu.yds. of fill on Route 5 from (AT 928527) to the Song Thu Bon Ferry. Road is complete from An Hoa to (AT 913507). (An Hoa)

19 July: Hauled and spread 305 cu.yds, offill and 8,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 300 cu.yds. of fill from (AT 930522) to (AT 932520). Loss of TD-20 tractors to mining incidents at the barrier project has reduced the land clearing atility by 50%.

20 July: Hauled and spread 315 cu.yds. of fill and 7,000 gallons of water on Route 1 south. Company "A" redecked a bridge on Route 5 at (AT 903777). Company "C" removed 30 mines at the ASP-1 minefield. An Hon road - Hauled and spread 460 cu.yds, of fill from (AT 928520) to (AT 922518).

21 July: An Hea road - Hauled and spread 212 cu.yds. of fill on Route 5 south from (AT 928527) to (AT 920513). Headquarters Company Construction Platoon has completed 18 towers ready for airlift in connection with the DaNang Barrier project. Five towers have been installed thus far.

22 July: Hauled and spread 250 cucyds, of crushed rock on Route 1 south. Company "A" removed an old bridge and replace it with one 30'X48" culvert. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 321 cucyds, of fill on Route 5 from (AT 920513) to (AT 919511).

23 July: Company "B" reports the wing walls filled and treadways completed at the Ha Thanh bridge. The bridge is 98% complete. An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 237 cu.yds. of fill on Route 5 south from (AT 919511) to (AT 918509).

24 July: Due to the loss of 1 Eimco, 1 grid roller, and one 550 grader by enemy activity on 23 Jul 1968 on Route 1, the upgrading of that road has stopped unitl additional assets can be made available.

25 July: 7th Engr Bn CP received 72" of rainfall during this reporting period. An Hoa road - Placed 50'X36" culvert at (AT 909481). The anticipated completion date of 31 Jul 1968 for the upgrading of Route 5 south from Phu Loc-6 to An Hoa will not be meet due in part to intensified enemy activity.

26 July: Hauled and spread 120 cueyds. of fill on Route 5 north and graded. Company "C" continues to progress in the removal of the ASP-1 minefield. As of this date 75 mines have been removed. An Hoa road -Stockpiled 125 cueyds. of uncrushed rock at the An Hoa crusher.

27 July: Hauled and spread 200 cu.yds. of fill on Route 5, graded same. Company "D" improved berms and defensive positions for artillery positions for artillery unit at An Hoa, Also mover personnel into new hootches at An Hoa.

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28 July: Company "C" has found, disarmed and removed all mines in the ASP-1 mine field. Assembled 20 ft. of 36" culvert at An Hoa, Headquarters Company, Construction Platoon has completed 26 towers for the DaNang Barrier project.

29 July: An Hoa road - Hauled and spread 123 cu.yds. of fill north of (AT 919519). Constructed 14°X36" culvert. Ist Bridge Company made minor repairs at the Ha Thanh Dam and the china boy at Hill 55.

30 July: Hauled and spread 285 cu.yds. of crushed rock on Route 1 south. Continued work on artillery installations at An Hoa. Delivered two Einco tractors with operators to the Tuy Loan bridge in support of the 1st Mar Div land clearing project.

31 July: Spread and graded 280 cu.yds, of crushed rock on Route 1 south. An Hoa road - Hauled and graded 228 cu.yds, of fill on Route 5 south.

1st Bridge Company FMF (AC 21325)

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Motor Transport

Approximately 146,759 miles were logged on the Battalion's Notor Transport Vehicles during July.

Maintenance

The Battalion Maintenance Platoon completed 151 Motor Transport work orders during the month of July. A total of 96 work orders were submitted, 9 were sent to Maintenance Battalion. Total work orders for Engineer Equipment numbered 66 with 83 completed and 9 were sent to FSR.

Messing

The Battalion Hese Staff continued to provide four meals daily except on Sunday; the fourth meal being a midnight ration for night crews. On Sunday a brunch replaces breakfast and dinner.

Medical

The Battalion Aid Station treated 766 military and 20 Vietnamese. During the month of July the Dental Clinic treated 600 military and 65 Vietnamese:

g. Civil Affairs/Civic Action

(1) The Civic Action Program continues on a daily basis.

(2) Activities were as follows:

(a) The McdCap Program provided treatment for two hundred fifty four persons.

(b) The Battalion sponsored, Vietnamese brickyard produced a total of 37,022 soil cement bricks during this period.

(c) A total of 35,220 soil cement bricks were issued for various civic action projects throughout Quang Nam Province.

(d) Through the manufacture of concrete well rings in the

Battalion sponsored brick factory, one deepwater well was constructed in the hamlet of An Ngai Tay, village of Hoa Thanh.

(c) Routine support was given small building projects through distribution of salvaged building materials.

(f) A five room school was completed in the village of Hoa

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(h) A hamlet chief's office was completed in the hamlet of An Ngai Tay.

(i) A public meeting hall in Hoa Thanh is 30% complete.
