Company A (Rein), 7th Engineer Battalion continues to support the III Marine Amphibious Force in the Danang area. The company continued the maintenance on 34.2 miles of road. Additionally, the company is also assigned to support MCB-3 in the repair of LTL-4 East and mine sweep of LTL-4 East also provide engineer equipment. The mine sweep team found and destroyed six pieces of enemy ordnance.

4. Motor Transport - A total of 47,171 miles were logged in by the company motor transport vehicles. There were 6,001 tons of earth products 199,000 gallons of non-potable water, and 20,000 gallons of oil hauled for road construction. There were 2,830 passengers transported and 1,430 tons of equipment and general cargo hauled.

5. Maintenance - The company maintenance platoon received 137 work orders of which 127 were completed. There were 38 work order opened at the beginning of the month and 16 of these were completed. There are 32 pending work orders, 2 of which are combat deadline awaiting parts, 12 are in higher echelon.
